Distinguished Health Educator Service Award

The Distinguished Health Educator Service Award recognizes an OPHA member who is a Health Educator that has demonstrated outstanding performance and accomplishments in the area of community health education or in health education research.

To be eligible for the award, nominees must be:

- A member of OPHA, AND
- Employed as a full time health educator (or part time health educator with at least five years of experience), OR
- Academic faculty

This award offers an opportunity to recognize individuals from a variety of public health and academic settings. Members of OPHA, state and local health departments, academic settings, other professional groups, and community organizations are encouraged to submit nominations.

Those submitting nominations should be able to document the nominees performance in any of the following areas including community health service, research or publication related to public health, leadership in public health, outstanding performance in health education projects, or other distinguished achievements.

The award will be made at the Combined Public Health Conference first annual Awards Dinner on Tuesday, May 2010.

The nomination should include the nomination cover page and a written essay (500 words or less, double spaced) outlining the candidates performance using any of the areas listed above. Additional letters of support are encouraged, but not required.
